Emergency Resolution on Israel and Palestine

At our Autumn Synod Meeting on Saturday 14 October, the United Reformed Church National Synod of Wales passed the following resolution:

The United Reformed Church National Synod of Wales expresses concern and condemns all acts of violence and retaliation. We stand for peace and unity and pray for the victims of the attacks in Israel and Palestinian - victims caught in the violent crossfire of retaliation. We echo the words of our Christian siblings – The Patriarchs and Heads of churches in Jerusalem:

As custodians of the Christian faith, deeply rooted in the Holy Land, we stand in solidarity with the people of this region, who are enduring the devastating consequences of continued strife. Our faith, which is founded on the teachings of Jesus Christ, compels us to advocate for the cessation of all violent and military activities that bring harm to both Palestinian and Israeli civilians...

It is our fervent hope and prayer that all parties involved will heed this call for an immediate cessation of violence. We implore political leaders and authorities to engage in sincere dialogue, seeking lasting solution that promote justice, peace and reconciliation for the people of this land, who have endured the burdens of conflict for far too long.
