Both are well and coping with advancing years. We shared some time chatting, laughing, remembering, and comforting. We even joined the dancing and singing along to 'Sweet Caroline', 'Save the last waltz', and 'Love me tender' - with Joy leading most of the words. They were wanting to know all about the chapel, and the news of how folk were. They send their love and greetings and ask to remembered to Rivertown & Garden City.

The communion table (ex Gdn City) is a solid reminder of all the blessings shared over many years.'

Co-incidentally, Sandra and her husband David (who's related to Joy) were with Joy and Bill that same afternoon, and they very kindly took Irene Ireland and myself along when they went again last Tuesday. You might be feeling that things have gone a bit quiet lately, so we'd like to update you on progress. The pace is continuing - so much so that Chris has found himself asking God to just slow down a bit!

The architects have redesigned the front of the building to make it more attractive and inviting, following feedback from a potential funder.

Planning permission was granted a few months ago and the Quantity Surveyor has provided costings for the building work (£1.7m).

Our funding strategy is to seek funds in three streams:

- large grants of up to £500k from 3 funders
- smaller targeted grants of up to £100k
- Operating costs for early years until we become financially stable

Johnny and Chris are contacting grant funders and gathering relevant information to prepare bid documents tailored to their specific criteria.

We have already passed Stage 1 for Wales Government strategic funding for £500k and will move to Stage 2 early next year. The typical time to secure funding is 6 to 9 months.

In partnership with FCC Regeneration, we have engaged a consultant, Marc Roberts, to create our business plan. He will present this to both FCC and the building team on December 8th. In the meantime Marc will be holding an open consultation on Monday 20th November from 12.45 to further develop ideas on what we can deliver for the community. All are welcome and existing user groups will receive a personal invitation. Your views are important, please come if you are available.

We have great support and enthusiasm from a variety of local and national organisations, who see Rivertown as a key strategic building and activity to improve things for the people of Shotton/Deeside and add great value to the town. These people include Wales Government regional development team, FFCs Migrant, Communities and Regeneration teams, and Flintshire Local Voluntary Council. All are full of positivity and passion for the project.

Great links continue to be formed as local people are heard, helped and enabled. Coleg Cambria and Theatr Clwyd are strategic partners, and BCUHB Public Health are exploring with us the possible incorporation of a permanent clinic space into the new building.

Finally, a few weeks ago members of the team had the chance to look round the old catholic school off Charmley's Lane car park, with a view to using the building whilst our own building is being renewed. We discovered that the school was not only in good shape but would easily accommodate both Rivertown Fellowship's needs and those of all the current groups. Using the school, which belongs to the Council, would not only ensure continuity but also enable work to go ahead smoothly and potentially save time and money.

Please continue to pray for and support the work we're doing - and if you want to know more just ask a member of the team!
